**COLOMBO / PINNAWALA / KANDY (Approximate travel time 03 - 04 hours)**

Helanka Vacations chauffeur Guide will meet you in Colombo and transfer to Kandy.

En route visit Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage.

Arrive to Kandy and check into the hotel.

Kandy was the capital of Sri Lanka during the ancient times of Kings and Queens. Nestling midst low hills and looped by the Mahaweli River, this religious city is one of the most sacred places of worship to Buddhists in the world and was also named a world heritage site by UNESCO.



Visit Peradeniya Royal Botanical Garden and Temple of tooth. Thereafter witness a Kandyan Cultural Dance Performance.



**Peradeniya Botanic Gardens**, botanical garden in Peradeniya, near Kandy, Sri Lanka, noted for its rich and varied collections of tropical woody plants. Occupying 59 hectares (146 acres), it has about 4,000 species of plants. The most important specimens of the garden include palms, some of which are planted in impressive avenues. Significant, too, are the collections of orchids, gymnosperms, and flowering trees.

**The Temple of the Tooth relic**; the crown jewel of the Kandy city is also known as Dalada Maligawa. 'Maligawa' translates to palace and the temple is a part of it. It has seen centuries of peaceful reigns and is one of the many historical places in the island.

Witness the **Kandyan cultural show** – A unique show of Sri Lankan traditional dance (fire and harvest dance), which include an entertaining fire-walking act. The artists dance to the beat of the drums, rising and falling to the lively tempo.

Return to the hotel for overnight accommodation.

Day 2

**KANDY / NUWARA ELIYA (Approximate travel time 3 - 4 hours)**

**After Breakfast proceed to Nuwara Eliya.**

Nuwara Eliya (City of Lights) is a resort city in the Central Mountain Range of Sri Lanka. Blessed with salubrious climate, breathtaking views of valleys, meadows, mountains and greenery; it's hard to imagine that Nuwara Eliya is only 180 Km from the hot and humid Colombo.



**Arrive and set on a sightseeing tour in Nuwara Eliya. You will able to visit Gregory Lake and Victoria Park.**

Nuwara Eliya, also known as 'Little' England', was the favorite hill station of the British who tried to create the resort into a typical English Village. The old brick Post office, country house like hill club, with its hunting pictures, mounted hunting trophies and fish, and its strict formal dinner attire; the 18 hole golf course, race course etc., evoke nostalgia of Colonial British Ceylon.

**Thereafter proceed to Ambewela Farm for an excursion.**

**Check into the hotel & overnight accommodation.**
